From the Pastor....

Easter Greetings!

I saw a post online the other day that jokingly said, "Move over, Jesus. BC means Before Covid now." I laughed a bit, but I also have been reflecting on it since. There have been several things in our world in recent history that have changed the way we look at the world. In these instances, there is a defined feeling of "before-and-after". These can have a pretty wise span of influence depending on how things played out. On a personal level, you might say that the birth of a child fits into this category. In Minneapolis, there is a very clear delineation of "beforeand-after" the murder of George Floyd. Nationally, the same is true of the destruction of the World Trade Centers on 9/11/01. Globally, there is no mistaking that the COVID-19 pandemic has drastically changed the way our world works.

In each of these instances (and the countless others that I don't have time to name), there is a pattern that plays out. At first, we have this sense of comfort or routine - we know what to expect and how the world works. During the event, there is often a sense of everything being out of control. And afterward, we have to figure out what reality looks like again in light of what has happened. It is this cycle of INSIDE THIS ISSUE Integration-Disintegration-Reintegration that has been a big factor in a lot of human resilience and evolution. It can be incredible disorienting, because all the things we took for granted are suddenly up for grabs and things that we could depend on end up being, to borrow a metaphor from Jesus, a house built on the sand. When this happens, as we are experiencing now, we have choices to make. When we begin to feel like we have a modicum of control, we have the choice to decide what the reintegration phase looks like.

That is what our New Normal gathering will help us look at. During this May 6th event, we will host a conversation where we are able to take a look at who we are in this present moment. I have found that it's really easy for churches to talk about their past, and I know that conversations like that are important and often a lot of fun. I know that, during the transition process which eventually brought me to St. Peder's, this was part of the discussion. Understanding the past is important, but it can also trap us into thinking that the past is the best we have to offer. It's also fairly easy for churches to talk about the future, to dream and plan and hope for what is to come. But understanding who we are in the present, between the before -and-after, is an important piece of growth. After a long time where everything felt out of control, we are beginning to feel like we can do more than just react to the headlines and we have some choices to make about what "normal" looks like again.

That's why I hope you'll come to the New Normal on May 6th. It's not just important for us as a congregation, but it also gives us a chance to understand how we live out the gospel in our neighborhoods. We are living in light of a lot of before -and-afters, including the before-and-after of Easter, and we have an opportunity not just to decide who we want to be as a community of faith, but also a chance to be honest and celebrate who we are. Hope to see you there.


Faith Formation Position at St. Peder's
