Hello from the Pastor's desk!

As the fall schedule kicks off, I've heard a number of folks commenting how busy they feel they've become. I'll admit that I'm one of them. And, looking a new school year in the eye, there are moments where I wonder how my family will be able to get everything done. And I know I'm not alone - someone recently told me, "I thought retiring meant I'd have more time to do the things I like. But I'm busy than I've ever been!" The result is that we're all extremely busy and sometimes it can get in the way of all sorts of things, including our mental and spiritual health.

I'm not really qualified on commenting on the mental health components of the hyperactive schedules that so many have adopted. But I have seen the spiritual consequences of ultra-busy lifestyles. Often, spiritual and mental health can take a backseat and can be seen as a luxury, not a necessity. As a pastor, of course, I remind people that spiritual health and spiritual practices are an important aspect of a healthy understanding of who we are and how we feel about ourselves. Eugene Peterson is the first pastor I encountered who encouraged people to be "unbusy." He advises, in his book <u>The Contemplative Pastor</u>, that the easiest way to make sure you have time to tend to your spiritual health - prayer, movement, therapy, or whatever else is needed - is to (ironically, perhaps) get it on the calendar before anything else can get to it. Because so many are busy, he essentially says that nobody questions it when people say, "I have an appointment." If it's on the calendar, people will assume it's important and will respect your commitment to following through.


Now, let me be clear, I am not saying this to make anyone feel guilty for being busy, for missing church, or anything like that. It would be the height of hypocrisy for me to tell people they need to slow down. There is a lot to do. But as your pastor, I care about you and your spiritual health. I want you to have a fulfilling life, marked with joy, grace, and hope. I want you to know just how loved and valued you are. I want you to not just know that you were created in the image of God, but also to see others as image-bearers of God, too. And that sort of life takes some work. So as we get into a busy fall, I encourage you find time in your calendar to block off some time, it can be as little or as much as you need, to commit to a spiritual practice that you find fulfilling. Find a time, even if it's just a few minutes, each day to be "unbusy." I hope that you can find a time to, as Psalm 46 puts it, "be still and know." I'm always happy to have conversation around how that can look for you.

Good to Know:


- At apartment building, please park on the street (parking lot is for residents only)


