### From the Pastor....

Dear Siblings in Christ,

School has been out for a while now and the backpacks have (finally) all been cleaned out. During this process, we'd remove each item, put it on the table, admire it, and then decide if it was something to keep or something that is ready to move along. This is the big task during the change between school and summer - unpacking what you needed last year and deciding if you still need it. Pencil stubs? Toss them. Books and cards? Keep. Art projects? Maybe grandma and grandpa will want those. You might be familiar with the drill.

This examination of our lives is a valuable process - especially in the face of change. In a lot of ways, we cannot control the change that happens around or in us; changes within society, health, the economy, our status, and families can all change quickly and without our consent. It can be difficult to accept, especially when so many of us were raised thinking that we can control our own destiny. These changes often accompany big emotions and sometimes even outright panic.

But I'd like us to think about this idea in the context of new life. New life is inherently different from "old life". Many times, new life means that ideas, practices, and habits that we've taken for granted will need to be questioned. Like the school backpack, things get put on the table and examined. Some things we will keep and put back in the backpack. Other things we will decide don't serve our needs anymore. When it's all done, our bags are lighter and it's easier for us to move around and find what we need without sifting through things that we don't need.

But this isn't just a personal process of self-examination in the face of change. It is happening all around us as our neighborhoods, country, and world change. This process is not just about removing what we don't need, but learning what our neighbors have been carrying, how they've been changing, and allowing ourselves to be changed by it. When we allow ourselves to be changed by the neighborhood, we are helping the community see more clearly, the love, grace, mercy, and new life of God. By allowing ourselves to be changed, we can be a part of God's hospitality and justice.

This isn't to say that we should become like everyone else. This doesn't mean that we should try to be cool or chase trends. It means that we can learn what is life-giving to others might be life-giving for us, too. Because new life is not just an individual process, but a communal process, too. We are learning, along with those around us, what God is doing in the world.


## Bible Study, Every Tuesday at 6 pm Upcoming Dates: August 1, 8, 15, 22 & 29

# Gather On The Green: Saturday, September 9th 4pm-7pm Silent Auction Items and Volunteers Needed



### **Note regarding June's Financial Report:**

Our revenue for June was significantly higher than usual due to a one-time payment from the government as part of the federal Covid-19 support program. The ERC (Employee Retention Credit), totaling over \$50,000, will be used to replenish money spent from our Building and Furnishing Funds/Savings on rehabilitating the parsonage last year. As often happens to congregations during the summer, we are running a deficit in our budget, due to a number of factors, including the assessment for the street work and the cost of energy, goods, and services increasing. While it is wonderful to receive this one-time ERC boost, we know that it is critical to make up our current budget deficit on our own instead of relying on this unique influx of funds. For now, the Church Council is thrilled to have more cushion back in our savings account to be able to respond to any critical needs or opportunities and help balance the budget if needed. Thank you, again, for your generosity and care for this congregation, the people in it, and the neighborhood in which it resides. Your generosity with your time, talents, and financial resources helps St. Peder's grow and thrive!
