Hello St. Peder's!

I've been doing a lot of Confirmation planning, so I wanted to give you all a glimpse into my philosophy when it comes to the process of teaching this time honored tradition. The term "confirmation" is actually a reference to baptism - it's called "Affirmation of Baptism" in our hymnals. Though there are many exceptions, in our tradition, it is typically children who are baptized. When children are baptized, they are brought before the assembled friends, family, and neighbors and they receive a blessing. There is nothing magic about the water, nor about the hands that hold or pour water over the head, but there is power in the words of God. In these words, we hear God's promises of love and inclusion for this person, we hear that they are part of the Body of Christ, and we hear that God will never abandon them.

The parents and sponsors also make a series of promises; to bring the child to worship, to teach them the basics of faith, to remind them that they are loved by God, and to lead them in a life of faith (to the best of their abilities) that is rooted in God's Word and God's grace. The congregation promises to love and care for them and to support the parents and sponsors as they begin the long journey of keeping the promises they've just made. In short, a lot happens in a baptism.

I like to compare baptism to a wedding. Weddings are a celebration, but the wedding is not more important than the marriage. Baptisms are also a celebration, but the promises that are made (and kept to the best of our abilities) are just as important.

Confirmation then is a coming of age for the students. During the confirmation service, they take on the promises their parents made on their behalf. In this rite, they claim for themselves the faith that was taught to them. It makes sense, then, that during Confirmation classes, we give them the ability to think critically about the promises they are about to make.

During these classes, then, we'll cover the basics of faith and help them gain skills to ask good questions, think critically about what they're hearing and how it applies to their lives, and give them the building blocks to find faith practices that will continue to help them grow. And they will grow and change, just as we all grow and change; not many of us are the same as adults as we were in 8th grade.

I grew up in days when I had to memorize verses and passages from Luther's Small Catechism. But, in these days, I'm less worried with how well the students memorize a Bible verse as with how they creatively and critically live out the faith the verse points to. I'm less worried with perfection and more with progress and practice. That's my hope for all of us, and I hope that, as we confirm some of our young folks and a new group starts their classes this month, we'll all remember the promises of baptism and the process of faithful growth and change.
