# The Messenger

Hello and Happy New Year!

I pray that your celebrations, travels, and gatherings were or will be (for those who spread out the holiday) joy-filled and safe!

I don't know about you, but after the holidays are done there is peculiar feeling. It is equal parts relief, gratitude, and uncertainty at what to do next. The long exhale that is the week after Christmas can sometimes leave us asking the "now what?" questions. In the Church year, the "now what?" is answered by the Day of Epiphany. Epiphany is the day which we commemorate the Magi (the Wise Men, as I grew up learning about them) following the star and finding the Christ Child in Bethlehem. Matthew 2, where the story comes from, isn't very descriptive. All we know is that they came from a long way away, following a star to find Jesus, and that they brought three gifts – gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

But there is more about them than what is just on the page. Their presence in our story is one that should make us pause. Their short story is one of the first indications in Matthew that God is doing something different that we might expect. The Magi are "outsiders" in every sense of the word – they have come from a faraway land, they are not Jewish, and they seem to have very little understanding of the political situation in Israel. Yet, they are named as important witnesses to God's presence found in this little child. They saw, more clearly than even the religious leaders at King Herod's beck-and-call, that God was up to something different, and they wanted to be a part of it.

Those "outsiders" teach us something about how God works in the world and they remind us that it is often those on the margins who see more clearly what is happening. They also foretell some of the struggles that Jesus will have with the authorities – not everyone wants to see the world change. And they also are a clear sign that God is not playing by the us-versus-them mentality. These Magi to bear witness to the way God is working. And they don't find Jesus in Herod's throne room, but in a small working-class family in a small village.


In the end, the presence of this group of outsiders reminds us of God's grace. None of them had the credentials or ritual purity to receive such an honor. None of them had earned the right to demand to see Jesus face-to-face. There is no gift they could bring that would pay back what Jesus would do for them and the world. They, just like us today, could do nothing but respond to God's gift. The gift of God that they beheld is still the gift given freely to you. I hope you'll find and follow the stars in your life and you find your way to the Child, too.
