From the Pastor....

Welcome to Lent!

There are some decisions that can be a struggle for me. Ask me where I'd like to go for dinner, my mind will go completely blank because there are so many great restaurants around here that cover all different cuisines. Ask me what my favorite song is, I will immediately ask for clarification (you've got to at least give me a decade and genre, or there are just too many good songs out there).

Of course, these are two pretty common and shallow examples. Those decisions aren't even that important. When choosing names for our kids, we literally pulled out books and family trees. Some decisions are more important than others and a name, an identifier that will follow a child throughout their lives, was a very important decision to make. When we chose names for our kids, Lisamarie and I wanted to honor the heritage and values of our families but also pick something that our children could grow into and make into their own legacy.

Names are often like that, especially in our faith lives. The Bible is filled with stories of names being given, changed, and lived out. Simon (meaning "shifting sands") becomes Peter (meaning "rock"). Abram (meaning "exalted father") becomes Abraham (meaning "father of multitudes"). These are just two examples and it's worth asking how the names reflect the values and lives of people.

That is why, in Lent this year, we are examining the words of our congregation's name. Throughout this season, a season often marked by fasting and prayer, we're going to be reflecting on what our name means and how we can express the values of that name in the world around us. For generations, this gathering of Christ followers has been known as St. Peder's Evangelical Lutheran Church and each word of that name was carefully chosen. Of course, the meaning of words changes over time, just as the popularity of some names have risen and fallen over time. As we examine, then, what our names mean and have meant, we will also think about what they can mean for us in the future.

In a time when the words and the names we use can become rote and ordinary, I hope that by time we reach the empty tomb of Easter, we'll have been able to spend some good time in reflection and we'll have a deeper understanding of the words of our name together. And as we do this internal work, along with fasting and prayer, we'll also be better equipped to do the external work of faith in the world.

The Cod Fish Dinner has been a been a St. Peder's tradition since 1942! Long time member, Dick Juhl, recently wrote up a short history of this wonderful event. His son, Peter Juhl, now carries on the tradition:

It was a bleak 1942. The Second world war was at it's height at about that time. St. Peder's Lutheran Church was struggling with so many men and women away in the armed services. Food was rationed, as well as things like shoes, tires, and on-and-on. Olaf Juhl, (my father) was also struggling to keep his Olsen's Fish Co. going, as his stock in trade was very limited. Olaf decided that St. Peder's Church should sponsor a cod fish supper to lighten up the tension the war was having on it's members. Olaf supplied the necessary cod. It was not the true cod from the Atlantic, but "black cod" from Alaska. An invitation went out to the membership, which was not very large in 1942. But, about six or eight men, signed up for the dinner, which was to be on a March, Friday as it is today. That beginning led to myself, Dick Juhl, becoming the chief cook for many years, and I did that until my son, Peter Juhl, took over as chief cook a few years ago.

Today, the cod fish dinner is still a highlight for many members, as well as neighbors, folks from around the Twin Cities, and even out of town. A hope of mine, and I believe from our church, that this tradition, of so many members helping out to make it happen all these years, will go, on for many more years of good food and fellowship. *-Dick Juhl*
